

## Guideline for Non Communicable Disease screening at Healthy Lifestyle Centers

To overcome the practical issues in implementing screening for NCD and risk factors at HLC, the following guide is prepared by the Directorate of NCD.

- 1. **Any apparently healthy person<sup>1</sup>, aged 35 years and above** should be registered in the Health Information Management System (HIMS) cloud and issued a Personal Health Number (PHN). They should be registered at the HLC and offered the NCD screening package and the Personal Medical Record (PMR).
- 2. Any person aged between 20 34 years and with risk factors<sup>2</sup> should be registered in the HIMS cloud and issued a PHN. They should be registered at the HLC and offered the NCD screening package and the PMR.

## <sup>2</sup> Risk factors

- 1. Smoking tobacco during the past one year
- 2. Overweight (BMI  $\geq 25 \text{kg/m}^2$ )
- 3. Abdominal Obesity(waist circumference: male > 90cm, female > 80cm)
- 4. Raised blood pressure (systolic blood pressure≥140mmHg or diastolic blood pressure≥90mmHg)
- 5. Symptoms suggestive of Diabetes Mellitus e.g. polydipsia, polyuria etc.
- 6. History of premature cardiovascular disease in first degree relatives (male relative < 55 years, female relative <65 years)
- 7. History of Diabetes Mellitus in first degree relatives
- 8. History of Familial dyslipideamia in first degree relatives

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup>An apparently healthy person is defined as: a person not diagnosed to have Cardiovascular disease [coronary heart disease, cerebrovascular disease, hypertension], Diabetes, Cancer, Chronic kidney disease, Chronic liver disease, Dyslipidemia

Any person mentioned above (1 or 2), irrespective of the area of residence should be registered in the HIMS cloud, issued a PHN and provided with services by the HLC.

- 3. Any person aged between 20 34 years without risk factors<sup>2</sup> could be registered in the HIMS cloud and issued a PHN. They are not eligible to be registered at the HLC or to receive a PMR.
- 4. A patient who is being regularly followed up at the Medical Clinic, irrespective of whether referred from HLC or not, should be registered in the HIMS cloud and issued a PHN. Clinical details and the CVD risk assessment of these patients can be entered in the Medical Clinic module of the HIMS cloud following its development.
